It is recognised that many of our villages have few shops and facilities, and residents are, therefore, heavily reliant upon travelling to other villages or towns. This can create linkages or relationships with other villages. Do you think this is the case with your village? If so, with which villages(s) do you have established/recognised ties?

There are no formal linkages / relationships or established / recognised ties with villages neighbouring Haconby, which are Morton and Dunsby

Are there any known infrastructure deficiencies in your village? If so, are these already being addressed?

Haconby has a church and a pub. There are no other facilities. A plan is forming to develop the church for community-centred activities.
There are deficiencies in public transport (not being addressed) and broadband speeds (to be addressed).

Are there any areas/issues which are of concern to the village (e.g., traffic, parking, lack of facilities, housing etc.)?

Issues of concern to the village include:
Lack of amenities, particularly for disabled residents and children.
No daily bus service.
Speeding into Haconby Drove along Chapel Street and along West Road into the village.
Parking on North Street.
Visibility of traffic at Hall Road / West Road junction opposite 'Hare and Hounds' public house.
Maintenance of pavements, and of drains prone to flooding.

Some villages are preparing a Neighbourhood Plan. Has this been considered by your village?

Yes. It was decided that preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan was beyond the capability of the Parish Council. It was thought that monitoring developments in adjacent Neighbourhood Plans might suffice but it did not and this has ceased.

Have the views of your community been sought on issues such as new housing etc?

Yes. A parish survey was carried out on the questions posed in Part 4: Supplementary Information section of the SKDC Village Services Facilities Survey. The views of our community have not otherwise been sought for at least a decade.

Land will need to be found for new housing during the life of the new Local Plan (up to 2041) in some of the District's villages. Does the Parish Council feel that your village would wish to be a Growth Village?
