ASB: There have been few reports of youths causing ASB over the last few months. During the summer holidays there were a lot less reports than had been anticipated.

We have seen a reduction in neighbourhood disputes in the village after input from Police and Council.

E-Scooters: We have noticed an increase in the use of E-Scooters across the sector and are working with owners to try to educate them on the laws concerning their use. If owners continue to use these in public places, then enforcement action will be taken.
